In short, we will act as your advisors to develop your design and bring tangible detail to your plans.

Four runners up will also benefit from a site visit & design consultation, where you can bounce your ideas off of our team to help move your project closer to realisation. Briefs aligning with Studio Wignall & Moore's expertise in art, craft and heritage will naturally stand out.

2021 WINNER - ELSECAR HERITAGE CENTRE

Elsecar is one of Yorkshire's very favourite places, with over 500,000 visiting each year. A model village built by Earls in Georgian times which became an international centre of industry.

The villagers mined there until the 1980s. The miner's strike started just a mile or so away. Now Elsecar bustles with makers, independent retail, events, festivals, pubs and people enjoying extraordinary places.

With the demolition of a gargantuan 1980s factory building, Elsecar Presents a unique opportunity: to create a landmark waterside development surrounded by remarkable historic sites.

Barnsley Museums and Barnsley Council are working with Studio Wignall & Moore to generate initial ideas for the site (as seen below), with the aim of creating positive impact on the lives of South Yorkshire communities and showcasing the region to the world.

BURTON CONSTABLE HALL

Fascinating English country house, complete with its historic collections – New single object museum to display the Burton Constable's Leviathan.

KIPLIN HALL & GARDENS

Elegant Jacobean Grade 1 listed house set in an estate of 160 acres - New build visitor centre and café

THE PIECE HALL, HALIFAX

The only remaining Grade I Georgian cloth hall in the world. Beautifully restored and re-imagined for the 21st Century this extraordinary site is now a nationally and internationally-recognised major heritage tourist destination in the UK – New creative space for self-led learning

YORK ST LEONARDS RUIN

Remains of hospital's undercroft, founded soon after the Norman Conquest, it was believed to be the largest medieval hospital in the north of England. The ruin sits next to York Central Library along the Roman City Walls.





2022 WINNER - COMMUNITY HOMES TEES VALLEY

Gresham, a ward in Middlesbrough is one of the most deprived areas in England. Community Homes Tees Valley wants to create a new model for regeneration in the area, providing high quality ecological driven renovations to serve the existing community without displacing any current residents.

Using an existing, uninhabited end of terrace building. Studio Wignall & Moore set out a template for new refurbishments in the area. Using low impact materials and products, the building aims to drastically improve thermal performance while creating simple but beautiful interior spaces. The building will provide a live/work unit with a ground floor space offering a functional use to serve the community and a residential unit above.





2022 RUNNERS UP

CALDERDALE INDUSTRIAL MUSEUM

Historic, volunteer operated museum. Proposal for the reinstatement of a Victorian Water Powered Lift.

YORK ARCHAEOLOGICAL TRUST WITH NOTTINGHAMSHIRE WILDLIFE TRUST

A collaboration between a number of established organisations, the trust sought to develop their ideas for a new archaeological visitor experience located in the Trent valley.

CARLTON TOWERS

An exquisite Gothic revival stately home. The entry concentrated on a number of redundant farm buildings with a view to transform them into a farm shop, restaurant and children's play area.

HERBERT LEIGH - BARROW IN FURNESS

The longest serving lifeboat at the barrow station, the Herbert Leigh and her crew saved countless lives. Now on display outside the dock museum, further protection is needed to reduce the need for costly annual maintenance.

The competition closes on the 31st of July 2023 at 18h00 (GMT). All email entries must be received before this time. Winner and runners up announced September 2023.

Following the announcement, Studio Wignall & Moore will make contact with the winner and runners up to arrange dates for the visits and initial consultations.

Attaching any of the below will help us understand a lot more about your proposed project, the list is not mandatory so just include what is appropriate to your project:


- Photos of the site the project will be situated in. (Please also include the site address.)
- Existing site plans or satellite photographs
- Sketches (no matter how well you can draw!) Will give us a much better idea of what your text is trying to describe. It can be a scribble, a diagram, a painting the quality of the drawing is irrelevant as long as it helps convey the idea.
- Any other example imagery to bring your idea to life

WHO OWNS THE RIGHTS TO THE COMPLETED WORKS?


